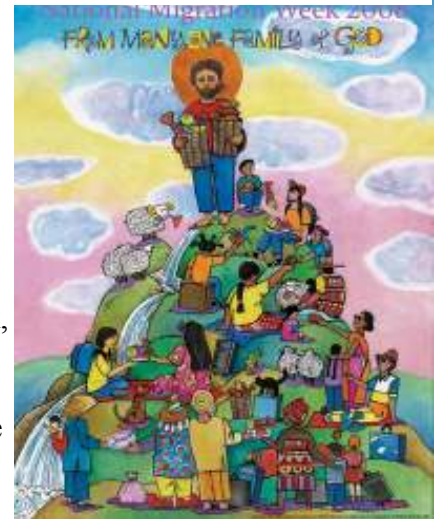

Approximately 500 people attended last year's binational All Souls Day Mass at the border of Sunland and Anapra, Mexico. Bishops Armando X. Ochoa, of El Paso, and Ricardo Ramirez, of Las Cruces, and Bishop Ascencio Leon of Juarez concelebrated the Mass on both sides of the tall chain link fence.

"The Mass is a tradition on the border and is meant for the living as much as for the dead. We gather to honor those who have lost their lives and to challenge the living to do what we can to look for comprehensive immigration reform," said Bishop Ochoa.
